Gloucestershire Mini, Junior, Senior, Padel and Disability County Championships 2022

A big thank you to East Glos Club and Oxstalls Sports Park for once again proving to be excellent venues for the County Championships. As the organisers we are very appreciative of the memberships, club officers and professional staff. The tournament provides a showcase of all the players from the different clubs across the county. Thanks to our sponsors this year with The Mortgage Brain supporting the event and presentation.

The 2022 event once again saw a few new events to County Championships with Mixed Doubles Padel and The Terry Parker Trophy Wheelchair tournament. The focus of the organising committee for the year was to make the event more friendly, sociable, and inclusive. Something which we feel was achieved with a good atmosphere amongst players, parents, and officials throughout the week. The Wheelchair tennis event, which competed for the Terry Parker trophy was held at East Glos to make the players feel part of the County Championships event, which they felt they did.

Most of the junior finals were scheduled for the Friday to make a celebratory day of it, including presentations and a social BBQ for all players and parents.

Entry numbers for the year were up by 15% with 185 different players competing in the 32 events scheduled, which included Ladies Open Singles and Doubles for the first time in several years. The figure of 301 entries were up on 2021 (241). There was player representation from 19 Clubs within the County.

Gloucestershire Junior County Tennis 2021 – 2022 report

This was our first full year of running County Training in the new format, which is weekly session for U11, U12, U14, U16 and U18. We did this so we can bring the best players in the County to train together on a regular basis and build their teamwork skills. We asked parents to complete feedback forms and it's all been very positive, so we are pleased with the progress. The U8, U9 and U10 age groups come together once a month for County Training at the weekend but after receiving such positive feedback from parents and players alike in response to the weekly sessions for older age groups and responding to enquiries about why we don't have a similar format for U8, U9 and U10, this is something I would like to consider and put forward to the Council for future. It would be fantastic to start introducing this from a younger age. For 2022, we have seen the positive effects of the She Rallies programme which has led to us adding a U9 & U10 girls only group along with the U16's girls, which Gloucestershire hasn't been able to sustain before.

We have brought in more Level 1 and 2 coaches, many of them ex County Juniors, to help deliver some County Training. This has given these young coaches some good experience and they are a great example to our Juniors about where their tennis can take them in future. Some of these coaches have travelled with us to County Cup events, so a big thank you to them for all their help and support.

We organised a Fun Day in the Summer at Oxstalls and asked coaches from all clubs across the County to invite players aged 6 – 8 years. This was a successful day and we had over 25 players attend and many of these players have now been invited to attend U8 County Training. Thank you again to the coaches involved and for the Clubs that put forward their players.



This was the first year that all County Cups went ahead without any restrictions, and it has been brilliant to see all the teams together and we have had some very excited juniors.

As always, myself and the other coaches will continue to assess players throughout the year and invite them to County Training if appropriate. Please see below final placement for each age group –

Following a successful first year, an adult wheelchair competition was held at the county champs, once again presenting the "Terry Parker Trophy" honoring his legacy. Thank you to Simon and Adam for organising and East Glos for hosting.

Visually Impaired tennis has become established with fortnightly sessions, getting off the ground with some Open Court and Active Gloucestershire funding and links with Neil Bates from H&W. Thank you to Neil for his expertise and time, to player Ed Hastings for his drive and enthusiasm and coach Corina (Oxstalls) and volunteer Clive for running the sessions. We are already looking at running some regional competition linking in with other counties, with Gloucestershire being a good central location.

There are plans for the introduction of deaf tennis as well as expanding the wheelchair offering within the county. If you or your club would like to be involved or need any advice or support, please let us know. There is an online "Open Your Doors' course on the LTA website which can be completed as a starting point.



Both Mckenzie and William are part of the LTA development performance squad on the pathway and their tennis has improved massively over the year. Both have been competing throughout the year with one of the highlights being playing at the British open held at the Nottingham tennis centre. This is an ITF event and they were

Report for the 74th Season (2021/22) of the Gloucestershire Tennis Dunlop League

Over the various league competitions during the year nearly 450 matches were scheduled. A full and successful year of tennis has been enjoyed in all the leagues this year after the interruptions over the previous couple of years due to the pandemic.

Seniors' League 2021/22

The Over 60s League runs from October to April each year. The 2021/2022 League commenced in October 2021 with 32 teams entered from 16 county clubs signed up to play. There are now 4 ladies doubles divisions, plus a mens' doubles division and a mixed doubles division. Congratulations to East Glos club who had winning teams in the mens' doubles, ladies doubles division 1 and the mixed doubles divisions.

Winter Floodlit League 2021/22

The mixed doubles, in its 24th season, commenced in September with 49 team entries from 19 county clubs. Congratulations to East Glos A team who won the Premier division, defeating Minchinhampton A team by 34 points. Two division trophies were won by East Glos Club (Premier and Division 1A) and two divisional trophies were won by Painswick 1B (division 1B and division 3A).

Men's and Ladies' Summer Leagues 2022

33 clubs across the county were represented in the Summer League. Congratulations to East Glos B team who won the Men's Championship, defeating East Glos A team by 1 point, and to East Glos A team who won the Ladies' Championship, defeating Minchinhampton A team by 4 points.

In the men's league, four divisional trophies were won by East Glos club (premier, division 1B, division 2A and division 4B), and two divisional trophies were won by Winchcombe (division 4A and 6B). In the ladies' league three divisional trophies were won by East Glos (premier, division 2B and division 3B), and two were won by Chalford (divisions 1A and 4A).

Accounts

The League's aim is to be self-financing, making a welcome contribution to the GLTA funds. The accounts for the year ended 30 September 2022 show there was income of £3,287 and expenses of £1,670 making a surplus of £1,617. The team fees will remain at £10 next year.

League Committee

The committee is currently comprised of nine members and seven participating clubs are represented. It met four times during the year, and the GLTA League AGM was successfully hosted at East Glos Club in March 2022. The 2021 Summer League trophies and the 21/22 Winter League trophies were presented at this meeting. This year we shall revert to the usual presentation of the Summer League trophies at the GLTA AGM in December 2022. The Seniors Over 60's League trophies will also be presented here.
